5 CONVICTED OF DRUG OFFENSES FROM RE6 CEIVING STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.
7 Subsection (r) of section 484 of the Higher Edu8 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1091(r)) is repealed.
