

2003-2004 Worksheet for FAFSA Question #35

The 2003-04 FAFSA Drug Conviction Question #35 affects your eligibility for federal student financial aid. It was needing more clarification by the questions below. Count only federal or state convictions that have not been removed from your record, or occurred after you turned 18, unless you were younger and tried as an adult.

1. Have you ever been convicted of selling or possessing illegal drugs (not including alcohol or tobacco)?

Yes - Go to question #2 below No - Answer #10 with a "1", sign and date at the bottom

2. Have you completed an acceptable drug rehab program since your last conviction?

An acceptable drug rehabilitation program must include at least 2 unannounced drug tests and

 ⇐ be qualified to receive funds from a federal, state, or local government or from federally – or state-licensed insurance company; or

 ⇐ be administered or recognized by a federal, state, or local government agency or court, or a federally- or state-licensed hospital, health clinic, or medical doctor.

Yes – Answer #10 with a "1", sign and date at the bottom No – Go to question #3 below

3. Do you have more than two convictions for possessing drugs?

Yes – Answer #10 with a "3", sign and date at the bottom No – Go to question #4 below

4. Do you have more than one conviction for selling drugs?

Yes – Answer #10 with a "3", sign and date at the bottom No – Go to question #5 below

5. Write the date of your last conviction for *possessing* drugs: _____/_____/_____

(If you have no convictions for possessing drugs, skip to #7)

6. If you have only **one** conviction for *possessing* drugs,

add one year to the date in question #5, and write that date

if you have two convictions, **add two years** and write that date: _____/_____/_____

7. Write the date of your last conviction for *selling* drugs: _____/_____/_____

(If you have no convictions for selling drugs, skip to #9)

8. If you have only one conviction for *selling* drugs,

add two years to the date in question #7, and write that date: _____/_____/_____

9. Write the later date from #6 or #8, this is your "eligibility date": _____/_____/_____

If your eligibility date in #9 is before July 1, 2003: answer #10 with a "1", sign and date at the bottom.

If your eligibility is July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004: answer #10 with a "2", sign and date at the bottom.

If your eligibility date is after June 30, 2004: answer #10 with a "3", sign and date at the bottom.

10. Has a drug conviction affected your eligibility for federal student aid? 1 2 3

"1" – means your eligibility for federal student aid is not affected

"2" – means your drug conviction(s) affect eligibility for federal student aid for part of the school year.

"3" – means you are not eligible for federal student aid for this school year unless you complete an acceptable drug rehab program.
